Greetings from beautiful Central Virginia! We enjoyed a busy and productive winter here at the AWM and are now set to tackle some exciting projects this spring. Over the past few months, we were able to complete the exhibit design for The Courage to Deliver: The Women of the Six Triple Eight Central Postal Directory Battalion. With the generous financial support of FAWMA, we contracted with Steve Feldman Design and now have the plans for a wonderful 720 square foot exhibit. The next step is contracting a fabricator to build the exhibit and hopes are to have a ribbon cutting early in 2024!

We had a busy March with Women's History Month. The AWM was able to support 22 Army and Civilian observances around the Department of Defense and our Digital Educator taught 18 classes that reached 1,179 students across the country. March also brought several media opportunities. We had a wonderful video made by our Public Affairs Office about the AWM, we were featured in the local CBS6 news, we were quoted or mentioned in a selection of print articles, and we were the focus of a Center of Military History Podcast (links to these features are available later in the newsletter). A big spotlight will come in April when MSG(R) Andrea Crabtree's interview, filmed at the AWM, will be featured on CBS Evening News with Nora O'Donnell.

Our efforts right now are focused on the April 27th Redesignation Ceremony. Fort Lee will become Fort Gregg-Adams in honor of LTG Arthur Gregg and LTC Charity Adams. We are anticipating big crowds on the installation that day and are very excited to host the Adams-Earley family and all the friends and family members of the 6888th who will be here to celebrate this historic event.

50 YEARS BEYOND: The Vietnam Veteran Experience

We are so excited that our friend, MAJ(R) Flo Dunn, is featured in a new exhibit called, "50 YEARS BEYOND: The Vietnam Veteran Experience" at the Virginia War Memorial. Flo, a Board Member with the Friends of the Army Women's Museum Association (FAWMA), is a volunteer and advocate for the AWM. We are thankful that visitors to the War Memorial will learn about Flo's service in Vietnam. The exhibit highlights 49 other Virginia Veterans through images and oral histories. FAWMA Digital Education and Live Studio (Micaela Procopio)

January to April was a busy couple of months for the Virtual Studio here at the US Army Women's Museum! January had a total of 222 individuals viewing our programs, including a repeat request from a high school in New York. In February I presented to an entire school in Wichita Kansas, which had 225 students attend! I also presented to a group of the Connecticut National Guard and then partnered with the Museum of the Pacific War in Texas to share the story of Charity Adams and the 6888th to a virtual audience of 300 for Black History Month. March is, of course, very busy because of Women's History Month and I presented to groups in Texas, Illinois, Virginia, Maryland, Louisiana, New Jersey, Georgia, and Connecticut. I partnered again with the Museum of the Pacific War to share Colonel Oveta Culp Hobby's story. I also was able to present the stories of women in WWII to the Center of Army Analysis at Fort Belvoir. In total, 1,179 people participated in programs during the month of March! I had such a wonderful time sharing the stories of these incredible women to so many great schools, and adult groups, including military members. It is a joy to hear how much people enjoy learning about these women for only an hour out of their day. We are looking forward to even more learning in the coming months!

D-Day Memorial Staff visit the Army Women's Museum



Thirty-five staff and volunteers from the D-Day Memorial located in Bedford, VA, visited the Army Women's Museum for a professional development field trip. The visitors were given a tour of the facilities by the AWM Curator and the Collections Curator. The museums have enjoyed a long and collaborative relationship with the D-Day Memorial.

2023 Fort Lee Martin Luther King Jr. Observance

The Army Women's Museum supported the 2023 Fort Lee Martin Luther King Jr. Observance. The guest speaker was MSG(R) Andrea Motley Crabtree, the first female Army deep sea diver who is featured in the "Be All You Can Be" gallery at the AWM. Crabtree shared a frank account of the challenges she faced in the Army diving program and the anger she felt when the MOS was closed to women and she had to reclassify. After the ceremony, MG Simerly hosted a reception at the AWM where MSG(R) Crabtree gave coins to outstanding Fort Lee Soldiers. A few weeks later, CBS Evening News with Nora O'Donnell filmed a segment with MSG(R) Crabtree at the AWM that is set to air in April.



Bobbie turned 101 on March 11, 2023. We wish her all the best for this coming year. She served during WWII and joined the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps a short while after the attacks on Pearl Harbor in 1941. She was sent to the University of Wisconsin to study Physical Therapy and was later assigned to work with amputees in France. After the war, Bobbie married her fiancé, Dale Fallon, who served in the Pacific Theater. The Fallons went on to have six children and a happy marriage spanning many decades.
